SEWERAGE AND WATER BOARD OF NEW ORLEANS

ROLL CALL

The Board of Directors for the Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans (SWBNO) met on Wednesday, November 19, 2025, at 9:02 a.m. in the Executive Boardroom. Special Counsel, Ms. Yolanda Grinstead called the roll and confirmed the following members were present: Mayor LaToya Cantrell, Director Joseph Peychaud, Director Janet Howard, Director Chadrick Kennedy, Director Tyler Antrup, Director Tamika Duplessis, Director H. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

Mayor Cantrell presented a motion to accept the minutes of the October 15, 2025, Board Meeting. Director Howard moved for approval of the minutes. Director Duplessis seconded. The motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION Committee

Director Howard reported on the summary and actions taken by the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee Report for the month of November was presented and recommended for approval.

- **Mayor Cantrell asked for a motion to amend the Finance report. Director Thomas moved to amend the Finance minutes. Director Scrubbs seconded. The motion carried.**

Mayor Cantrell stated SWBNO has sent notices to homeowners regarding their meters. Additionally, 64% of customers with recognized past due amounts have signed up for assistance. This indicates significant progress in serving customers. It is essential to note that people are responding to the measures implemented to help them manage their large bills, specifically the recognized past due

amounts, and they have arranged to settle their accounts with the utility, which is a notable achievement.

GOVERNANCE Committee

IMPORTANT ATTENTION NEEDED

Dear Valued SWBNO Customer,

We recently updated our inventory that tracks the materials used in water lines throughout the city. Our records show that some water lines are older, which may contain lead.

Dear Reader:
The Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans is committed to public health, and we work to make sure your water line meets federal water quality standards. We are developing a schedule to confirm privately owned water lines. If your water line is made of lead, we will replace it with either plastic or galvanized steel, and we will work with you to replace it to protect your water quality.

Protecting Your Health:
Even though lead is in the pipe, it does not necessarily mean your tap water contains lead. SWBNO adds lime to the water we treat, which helps decrease the likelihood of lead dissolving into the water as it travels through the pipes. Lead is a metal that can affect the way your body functions. It can affect the way your brain and nervous system work, among other things. Plumbing materials made with lead, usually found in older homes, may contain lead. Infants and children can have decreases in IQ and attention spans. Lead exposure can also affect the way a person's body grows and develops. Adults can have increased risk of heart disease, high blood pressure, kidney, or nervous system problems.



Mayor Cantrell asked for a motion to approve Corresponding Resolutions in Globo. Director Kennedy moved to accept Corresponding Resolutions as proposed. Director Scrubbs seconded. The motion carried.

Prior to the end of the meeting, Honorable Mayor Cantrell delivered her closing remarks. Mayor Cantrell highlighted the recent groundbreaking at Willie Hall Playground in District D, which is expected to significantly improve water retention, addressing the area's historical flooding issues. A resident noted that they experienced routine flooding during their childhood, and they are now 53 years old. This highlights the long-standing issues that have been addressed. The city is actively engaged in efforts to mitigate these issues for the future benefit of New Orleans residents. Currently, there are over 128,000 water meters installed, and more than 317 linear feet of drainage lines have been cleaned, alongside nearly 7,400 catch basins. This work will continue throughout the year and is aimed at progress leading up to 2026.

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PUBLIC COMMENT

- Ms. Angela Kinlow, a local resident, has raised concerns about Proposition 3, which is part of the \$510 million bond initiative intended to allocate \$50 million for improvements to the drainage and stormwater systems. This initiative aims to mitigate flood risk throughout the city. The community wants to ensure that the Sewerage and Water Board drainage system receives the adequate funding for effective drainage.
